REFOCUSED ON GIRARD



Last year, the board of the History Center recognized a need to refocus the organization's efforts on our 120-acre farm known as the Battles Estate in Girard. I am very pleased to report substantial progress both from a construction front as well as programmatic.

This past July, we unveiled the fully renovated Yellow House to our membership. After four months of work by volunteers, professionals, and our staff, the house has been transformed both inside and out: new painting, furniture, decorating, lighting, and HVAC.

The house is now available for classes, special events, and rentals. In addition to Yellow House renovations, we have begun a multi-phased effort to renovate the White House's exterior: siding replacement and painting, new gutters and repainting and sealing the roof.

We planted thousands of sunflowers between the two houses for aesthetic appeal and recently hosted sunflower picnics with wine and charcuterie boards.

Programmatically, we are working with a culinary theme for the estate as it pays homage to the historical roots of the property as a working farm. To that end, we are hosting a community-wide BBQ on September 28, and a locally sourced Farm to Table Dinner on September 29 and 30.

In addition, we will convert the Yellow House into a pop-up restaurant for two weekends in November. The pop-up will be in partnership with Red Letter Hospitality which owns the Cork 1794 and Skunk & Goat. We are calling our restaurant "The Red Door at the Yellow House." This October will kick off the next 12 months of culinary classes at the Yellow House with a different seasonal focus each month.

Fall is one of the most beautiful seasons to visit the Battles Estate, so we invite you to discover or rediscover this magnificent historical asset at one of our upcoming events!



Students toured historic sites, learned some incredible things about Erie County's history and they had fun doing it! Special thanks to our camp directors Abbie Harrington and Laura Howard.


